Jarrett valiantly combated Malignant Melonoma, for the second time. Malignant melanoma is only found in 1 in 350,000 kids under the age of 18. There are only about 500 cases in the United States. Ranked 50th among a class of 920, Jarrett was a "Scholar Athlete" (received his first ever "B" in school his sophomore year while initially treating this disease) participating in basketball, baseball, and football.

Christopher Jarrett Boston, age 17 of Lawrenceville, GA passed away on Wednesday, February 22, 2006 after a heroic 3 year battle with Melanoma. Jarrett was a much loved son, brother and friend. Jarrett was a Junior at Collins Hill High School, where he played football as quarterback, basketball as point guard, baseball as a left fielder and played tennis. He was a gifted student who never received a grade lower than an A in any subject from kindergarten through his sophomore year.
